THE FIRST EDITION OF "THE MILLSTONE" HAS PROMPTED THESE ENQUIRIES:

LETTER FROM LYNN ANDERSON OF MOSMAN:

"Can anyone help us find the true Daniel Mahoney who married Leah Shrimpton on 19.2.1849 at Colo River (Wilberforce).

OBVIOUSLY DANIEL ARRIVED IN AUSTRALIA BEFORE 1849 - DID HE COME AS A CONVICTOR AS A FREE MAN? DID HE COME FROM IRELAND OR FROM ENGLAND? THERE ARE FAMILY "STORIES" THAT MEET EACH AND EVERY ONE OF THESE QUESTIONS! ALSO, UNFORTUNATELY THERE WERE A NUMBER OF DANIEL MAHONEY'S IN THE COLONY AROUND THIS TIME.

DANIEL AND LEAH HAD A NUMBER OF CHILDREN 1. ANN, BORN 1844 MARRIED 1862 TO GEORGE WILLIAMS.

- 2. CHARLES EDWARD, BORN 1846, MARRIED 1870 TO JANE SHEPHERD. CHARLES LIVED ON COMLEROY ROAD JUST BEYOND BLAXLANDS RIDGE ROAD, ACCORDING TO THE BOOK "KURRAJONG".
- 3. Daniel, Born 1848, Married 1873 TO CATHERINE McCabe. Daniel Lived on Comleroy Road, apparently not far from Wheeney Creek. According to the Book, "Kurrajong" was the furthest house out on the Road apparently Syd Sheldon Later Bought this property, Maybe from Daniel's estate?
- 4. Mary Ann, Born 1852, Married 1877 TO THOMAS WALKER. THOMAS WAS POST MASTER AT KURRAJONG HEIGHTS FOR MANY YEARS, OPERATING FROM "LOCHIEL HOUSE", AND ALSO OWNED PANORAMA POINT.
- 5. JOHN RICHARD, BORN 1854, MARRIED 1878 TO SARAH KILLEN.
- 6. JAMES ALBERT, BORN 1857, MARRIED 1877 TO SUSAN SHEPHERD.
- 7. HARRIET E. BORN AND DIED 1859.
- 8. ELIZA MARGARET, BORN 1859 1878 TO ALBERT FLETCHER.
- 9. LIA JANE, BORN 1862, MARRIED 1880 TO JOHN HYSLOP.
- 10. AN INFANT, BORN AND DIED 1864.

LEAH MAHONEY, NEE SHRIMPTON, DIED IN CHILDBIRTH IN 1864. MANY OF HER CHILDREN WERE STILL VERY YOUNG - DID THEY STAY WITH THEIR FATHER, DANIEL OR NOT? HOW DID THEY MANAGE? WAS DANIEL FARMING IN THE COLO RIVER/ WILBERFORCE, FREEMANS REACH AREA?

MY WIFE IS A WALKER, SO DANIEL AND LEAH WERE HER GREAT-GREAT GRAND PARENTS.

I WELCOME ANY INFORMATION ANYONE MAY HAVE ON THIS FAMILY - ANY OF ITS ANCESTORS AND ANY OF THEIR DESCENDANTS - AND I AM HAPPY TO PASS ON ANY INFORMATION I HAVE WHICH MAY BE OF INTEREST TO OTHER MEMBERS OF THIS EXTENDED FAMILY.

LETTER FROM JUDY FITZPATRICK:

"I AM RESEARCHING THE FAMILIES OF CHARLES FREDERICK FREDERICKSON (B C 1850'S) AND MARY ANN GREENTREE (B 1857 TO THOMAS GREENTREES AND CATHERINE COHEN). I BELIEVE THEY WERE MARRIED AT MCDONALD RIVER, THOUGH THE MARRIAGE WAS REGISTERED AT WALCHA AS CHARLES FREDERICK FRETSON AND MARY ANN GREENHEE IN 1881.

There appears to be a number of Greentrees in your district and I was hoping you may be able to assist me with some details on this family. \nearrow

CHARLES FREDERICK FREDERICKSON WAS BORN IN SWEDEN AND I AM HAVING A DIFFICULT TIME TRYING TO FIND ANY INFORMATION ABOUT HIM.

THE SWEDISH CONSULATE IN VICTORIA INFORMS ME THAT THE SURNAME "FRETSON" IS NOT SWEDISH. IT APPEARS TO ME THAT THIS NAME MAY BE JUST AN INCORRECT TRANSLATION.

LOUISA'S MISTLETOE, JAN WRITES IS: "A SELDOM SEEN SHRUB, LESS THAN 2 METRES TALL AND WITH OPPOSITE PAIRS OF YELLOWISH GREEN LEAVES THIS ATKINSONIA IS THE SORT OF BUSH WHICH MIGHT NOT COMMAND MUCH ATTENTION WHEN NEGOTIATING LUMPY SANDSTONE AND PRICKLY SHRUBS IF IT WERE NOT IN FLOWER.

LOUISA ATKINSON UPDATE CONTINUED...

"IT HAS A LOCAL DISTRIBUTION SPANNING LESS THAN 100kms, A RARE OR THREATENED AUSTRALIAN PLANT LISTING AND A SURPRISINGLY INTERESTING STORY.

"The plant family, Loranthaceae, to which our small treasure belongs. Is comprised of hemiparasites ('hemi-' from the Greek, implying partially, and '-parasite', an organism growing and feeding on another). Another hemiparasite, the mistletoe of Christmas lore, Viscum album, belongs to the plant family Viscaceae.

THE CULTIVATION OF HEMIPARASITIC PLANTS PROVIDES QUITE A CHALLENGE TO PLANT PROPAGATORS. OUR NURSERY MANAGER, SENIOR HORTICULTURIST, KAREN SILVESTER, WITH ENCOURAGEMENT FROM THE HORTICULTURAL RESEARCH COORDINATOR FOR THE ROYAL BOTANIC GARDENS, HAS ACHIEVED SOME PROMISING EARLY RESULTS.

THERE ARE NO ESTABLISHED PLANTS OF ATKINSONIA LIGUSTRINA WITHIN THE CULTIVATED AREA OF THE GARDEN THOUGH YOU WILL BE INTRODUCED TO THIS PLANT IF YOU PARTICIPATE IN THE ECOTOURS OF TOMAH SPUR OFFERED AT MOUNT TOMAH".

Our society and the MT Wilson and MT Irvine society have agreed to work together to mount a dsiplay on Louisa at Mt Tomah in 2003. Members interested in this project can contact Jennifer Stackhouse on 4576 1221. Louisa Atkinson lived 1834 -1872.
